June 15th - Buck Island Pursuit Race, Temp 55', Winds 15-22 mph

The Hobie 16 crews were excited, prior to the start of this race, as they squeezed into their dry suits to keep warm. Starting twenty-six minutes after the much slower first boat, the crews knew the brisk winds favored the much lighter Hobie in this pursuit race.

Brian/crew (Hobie) rounded the windward mark in 1st and kept the lead all the way to the finish line. Greg C/crew (San Juan 21) were second at the mark but proceed to lose that spot over to Matt/crew (Hobie) taking 2nd. Hoping to keep their 3rd place spot, Greg/crew raised their spinnaker and cruised to the finish line. Dean/crew (Santana 20) finished 4th, followed closely by Lisa/crew (Santana 20) in 5th. Mike Bliss/crew (Express 27) finished 6th, while Tim B/Crew (San Juan 21) crossed the line in 7th. Ed/Crew (San Juan21) took 8th while finishing up 9th on his first sail of the year was Mark/crew (S2-6.9). It was great to see Vince at the helm, albeit on Mark's Boat.

It was nice to see 4 boats sailing down the lake, back to the finish line, under their spinnakers in the more manageable winds of 13-15mph. The rest of the keel boats chose to go wing-on-wing with their run to the finish.

Stalwart Captain Mick and his crew (chase boat) were available to assist, if called upon, for the safety of the sailors. But it was not required on this blustery race day with temps climbing to 55' per the KYC weather station.

Following the race, Carolyn and Dick Ford, along with their kitchen crew, prepared some 50+ servings of personally-topped woodfired pizza pies, (so yummy). The homemade woodfired pizza oven is a wonderful tradition, started by Stephanie Carpenter and her late husband Jim.

Thank you for all that assisted in making this a fun day of racing, dining and camaraderie. My day ended with friends and the sunset while enjoying a tasty beverage prepared by Suzi at our *Barley Afloat*.
